

FAQ – What are the rules for Crown and Anchor?

What is your advice on running a Crown and Anchor stall?

Crown and Anchor stalls are popular in Jersey but we would strongly urge anyone who is thinking of using one at an event to only deal with a licensed operator. It's a form of gambling that requires some expertise in operation – there is a real danger that you could lose money unless you have an experienced operator.

What do I have to do?

We would recommend that the rules are very prominently displayed in both English and Portuguese so that everyone understands them properly. You will be required to take proper records – although in a fast-paced game such as Crown and Anchor, those will cover money in, money out and expenses.

Can children play Crown and Anchor?

Yes, they can. But they can only do so with parental or guardian consent and supervision. That means that the parent or guardian must be physically with them and supervising while they are playing – it is not enough to simply tell children they have permission to play and then leave them at the stall.
